He also lends regular support to both the Dorset and the South-West-South (serving all of Somerset, Devon and Cornwall) sister-service FCAMHS teams. These are some of the new NHS-England services, commissioned collectively to cover the geography of England.

Dr Bigg also works within a CAMHS team in South-East Hampshire and is Named Doctor for Safeguarding Children for the Hampshire CAMH Service. He has a particular interest in Complex Trauma and like many of his peers is gathering great experience and some expertise in the many facets of autism on a daily basis!
